



COVID-19 RESPONSE CHART

Worker came in contact with someone who came in contact with a known COVID-19 patient.

No action necessary. Return to work and follow chart below should anything change.

Worker arrives sick or becomes ill while at work

Send home and ask that they stay home until at least 24 hours after their fever or last symptom is gone

Worker informs you that they may have been in close contact with a person who may have COVID-19

Ask them to monitor themselves for symptoms and ***promptly inform you if they become ill or it is determined that the person tested positive***

Worker can return to work if they have no symptoms
If informed later see next red box

Worker informs you that they have been in close contact with someone KNOWN to have COVID-19

Send home immediately and ask that they isolate themselves and self monitor for symptoms

Ask that they let you know promptly if they receive a positive test for Covid-19

Worker found to have COVID-19

Follow procedures on accompanying flow chart

The CDC defines close contact as:
•Being within approximately 6 feet (2 meters) of a COVID-19 case for a prolonged period of time; close contact can occur while caring for, living with, visiting, or sharing a health care waiting area or room with a COVID-19 case –or –
•Having direct contact with infectious secretions of a COVID-19 case (e.g., being coughed on).

We will NOT require return to work slips from worker's physician
